- **Exhibition Chairperson** – We plan our exhibitions two years out. This coming exhibition is in Clarksville, TN and Tuva Stephens is the chair. Our 2021 Exhibition is in Quincy, FL at the Gadsden Art Center to be led by Linda Pelc. If you are interested in helping these two leaders, please don't hesitate to contact them.

WE start with what is important to YOU. We build on that to make the strongest painting possible. Participants will create paintings using the elements of shape, line, value and color to simplify subject and use a variety of color plans to create emotion and mood. Discussion of content, the importance of color schemes and line quality will also be discussed.

Participants will also work intuitively with shape, color, line and especially texture to produce an abstraction with a personal focus and a representational work based on personal reference choices. A variety of 'slippery surfaces' will be explored. These paintings will be as fun and absorbing to view, as they are to paint.

There will be both group and individualized instruction with time set aside for critique. This is a fast moving, fun, mixed water media workshop where we all learn and share. All levels are welcome as long as everyone is comfortable with their materials. ~
